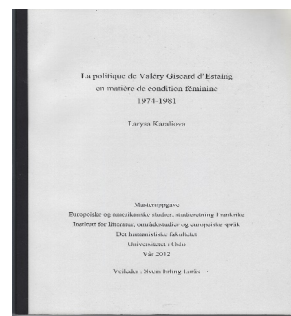


Figure 3. *La politique de Valery d’Estaing en matière de condition féminine* 1974-1981 (in French).

She published the essay—*La politique de Valery d’Estaing en matière de condition féminine* 1974-1981 (in French), **Figure 3.**

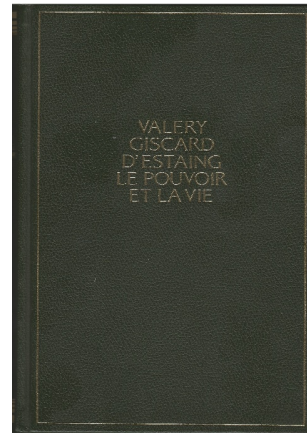


Figure 4. A book *Le Pouvoir et Lavie*.

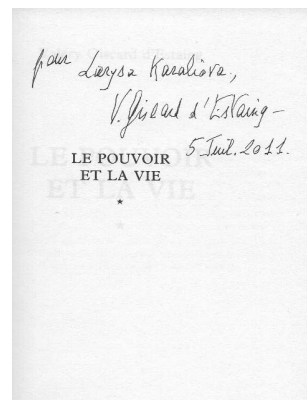


Figure 5. Valery Giscard d’Estaing signed two volumes of his book *Le Pouvoir et Lavie* and gave as a present to Larysa in the recognition of Larysa’ knowledge and skills.
